Farmland School Tax Rebate

Manitoba Agricultural Services Corporation

Deadline: March 31st, 2017



The MB government is offering a rebate of up to 80% of the school taxes levied on your farmland for 2016. The Farmland School Tax Rebate reduced the net school taxes paid on your farmland. Your application for the 2016 tax year must be received by MASC by March 31, 2017.

How it works: If you are a Manitoba resident who owns farmland in Manitoba and you paid your 2016 property taxes, you may be eligible for the rebate. The rebate applies only to the school taxes assessed on your farmland and does not apply to residences or buildings.

How to apply: If you received a rebate for 2015, a 2016 form was then mailed to you. You can also download an application form from masc.mc.ca.

Building Inspector Report

With spring fast approaching, the construction season is heating up. Here are a few "need to knows" if you are planning a project this year:

- Construction of any new building over 108 sq. ft. requires a building permit;
- Renovation projects where anything structural (lintels, headers, beams, cantilevers, floor joist and roof rafters) will be changed, removed, or altered in any way requires a building permit;
- Any sized deck elevated 2ft. above ground level requires a Building Permit;
- Moving any structure over 108 sq. ft. onto your property (sea can, RTM, mobile home, etc.) requires a Building or Development permit!
- If you are unsure if you need a permit, contact the RM Office or Building Inspector!

Why do you need a permit and inspections?

1) Helps protect property value

Your home or business is an investment. If your project does not comply with the codes adopted by the RM, the value of your investment could be reduced.

2) Saves Money

Property insurers may not cover work or damages caused by work done without permits and inspections.

3) Makes Selling Property Easier

When property is sold through a multiple listing association, the owner must disclose any improvements or repairs made to the property and if permits/inspections were obtained. Many financial institutions will not finance a property without proof of a final inspection. If you decide to sell a home or building that has had modifications without a permit, you may be required to tear down the addition, leave it unoccupied or do costly repairs.

4) Improves safety

By following code guidelines, your completed project will meet minimum standards of safety and will be less likely to cause injury to you and your family. Mandatory inspections complement the contractor's experience and act as a system of checks and balances resulting in a safer project.

5) It's the Law

Work requiring permits are established by Municipal by-law. Work without a permit may be subject to removal or other costly remedies.

- Vassar North - Vassar to Whitemouth Lake Rd (Rd 20N)
- Vassar East MM (Rd 6N); Vassar East Rd to PR 308
- Municipal Road 12N from PTH 12 to PR 210

Road locations are subject to change. Once restrictions are implemented they will remain until further notice.

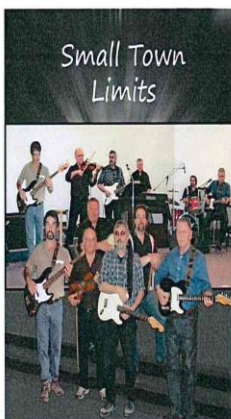


