### Setting Down New Roots: Tree Planting Workshop





#### Spotted Knapweeds

The RM of Piney would like to make residents aware of the effects of Spotted Knapweed plant. Spotted Knapweed is an invasive weed species with the potential to cause harm to pasture and rangelands. Prior to 2010, the only known infestation of spotted knapweed in the province was at a gravel pit near Sprague. That year it was found near Beausejour, Birds Hill Park, just west of Winnipeg, and south of Steinbach along Highway 12.

Spotted knapweed, usually mistaken for Canada thistle, is purple or pink with stiff bracts that are black tipped giving it a spotted appearance. It is not spiny or prickly with portions of the leaf blades being narrow. The basal leaves are deeply lobed and arranged in a rosette with the stems being stiff and upright. Spotted Knapweed flowers from June to October.

The course of action after a confirmed infestation depends on the number of plants. One plant can easily be pulled and it is recommend to bag and burn it. If it looks like the stand has been there for a number of years, a herbicide application will probably be needed. Suspicious plants should be reported to the municipal weed supervisor.



#### RM of Pinev Burn Bans

At this time, we would like to remind everyone that burn bans implemented by the RM of Piney are to be followed and respected. RM burn bans are put in place by council to reduce the risk of wild fires within the municipality. Even if a burn ban is lifted by MB Conservation, the RM can still have a municipal burn ban in place. This ban must be lifted by a resolution of council.
