RM HIGHLIGHTS

Manitoba – Minnesota Transmission Line – Construction has commenced on the Manitoba – Minnesota Transmission line. Crew are working in the Piney area clearing land and preparing for further construction activities. Please be aware of the increased traffic in the area.

Coffee with Council – The RM of Piney Council held two "Coffee with Council" meetings early September. Thank you to all that attended and provided valuable input to the Development Plan and asked questions. A range of topics were discussed, which included unsightly properties, crown land management, playgrounds, recreation, provincial roads, jobs and economic development. Council was pleased to have the opportunity to actively discuss these topics and more with residents.

Seniors Care Facility – The RM of Piney, along with its partners East Borderland Community Housing and the Piney Regional Chamber of Commerce have agreed to investigate the feasibility of Supportive Housing which would service Southeast Manitoba. This group is in the final stages of developing a survey to assess services and housing options within the region. When you receive the survey, please take the time to complete it; your involvement is extremely important and responses will help shape how housing and services are delivered to seniors in the RM of Piney.

Speed By-Law – The RM of Piney Council recently adopted a By-Law #132/2019 to regulate vehicle speeds on some municipal roads. Please be aware of posted speed limits within the RM, new signs will be placed in the coming months.

Piney Stuartburn Economic Development District – The RM of Piney and the RM of Stuartburn have jointly entered into an agreement for the delivery, improvement and promotion of economic opportunities within the Southeast Region. The District's activities will focus on economic development, tourism and community development. COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT







Legend has it that Menisino's Aboriginal name means 'many sands and crooked roads'. Menisino was a settlement in the late 19th century, long before the railway was even laid. Its sole inhabitants at that time were trappers. With the railway in 1906, came settlers. They were mostly Scandinavians who worked as lumberjacks, and small-scale cattle farmers. The area became quite densely populated due to the timber available. The Morden-Sprague Highway (PR 201) ran through like a trail. People depended on the railroad for transportation to Winnipeg. The train took cream to the Gardenton creamery Saturday morning, and took logs to Winnipeg.

Menisino boasted of three stores, a restaurant, boarding house, post office, community hall, church, and a school that is said to have held 45 students. Most of them had to walk up to three miles to go to school.

Menisino is known to be a friendly town where neighbours helped neighbours and doors were always open for a coffee. Sometimes there were herders who came from outside the area with their herds of horses or cows and were hosted in homes.

Menisino was also part of the "Back To The Land" program where unemployed Winnipeggers were given land, a team of horses, and allowed to farm for their living. It was not always successful.

A notable story took place in March of 1952, when three bank robbers from Winnipeg got stuck near Horseshoe Lake and wandered into Menisino in search of a ride. They bought some bread and canned ham from the store, and then caught the train to Piney and Sprague, where they were finally captured.

Far from its action-packed roots, Menisino is currently a dwelling for seasonal and weekend farmers. There are no town businesses or schools, but the berry picking is still good and memories run rampant.
