A special weather statement is in effect for our area

By taking a few simple steps today, you can become better prepared to face a range of emergencies. It is important that everyone know the risks and that they have a plan in place. Here are some useful tips:

- Stay up to date on weather statements and alerts.
- Take precautions to protect your property
- Make sure valuables are safe
- Prepare for a power outage – fill your car and fuel cans (for your generator)
- Maintain emergency supplies – fresh water, batteries, flashlights and non perishable food
- Ensure all pumps are operational

Emergency preparedness is a shared responsibility. The RM of Piney has resources available. Dependant on the emergency sandbagging should be a community and volunteer response. For those in high risk areas, there are empty sandbags available at the following loctions:
