COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT



Moodie and Hickey



Moodie was a logging town located southwest of Whitemouth Lake on the CN line. It was named after an officer of the Canadian Northern Railway. Only four to five families lived there in primitive camps. Everyone owned a sawmill. Each sawmill needed five or six men to operate it. When the loggers were working, you could hear the train whistle from Moodie to Whitemouth Lake. Because of its remote location, residents of Moodie followed the railroad track to other towns.

There was no store, school, or post office. The only storetype business was a building where people from out of town brought items for residents to pick up, kind of like a trading post. The nearest school was five miles away, in Vassar. The school had a camp for older children who could fend for themselves, where they would live during the week and go home to Moodie on the weekends.

The last family to live in Moodie was the Remple's who moved out between the 70's and 80's. Nothing remains of the settlement.

Hickey was a railway point southeast of Whitemouth Lake, used for loading wood. It was named after L. D. Hickey, CNR Assistant Superintendent at Rainy Lake, Ontario.

Burn Awareness Week

February 2nd - 8th, 2020

Each year, the first full week of February is recognized as **Burn Awareness Week (BAW)**.

A burn is a type of skin injury that occurs when the skin or other tissue is damaged by coming into contact with: chemicals, hot surfaces, foods, liquids, air/steam, radiation, fire, electricity or hard surfaces that cause a friction burn.

A few simple tips to help keep you and your little chef safe from potential burns:

- Cool a burn under cold running water for 10-15 minutes and call 9-1-1 for serious burns.
- HOT ON NOT YOUCH
- 15 minutes and call 9-1-1 for serious burns.
 Always supervise children in the kitchen and dining areas.
- Create a "No Child Zone" while preparing and serving hot foods/beverages. Don't carry or hold a child while cooking on the stove.
- Use the back burners of your stove and turn pot handles away from its edge; also, keep hot foods away from the edge of your counters.
- Keep clothing away from flames or heating elements.
