RM of Piney Fire Fighters

The RM of Piney fire departments are urging everyone to remember fire safety as they deal with the COVID-19 pandemic. As people find themselves spending more time at home for work, self-isolation, or practicing physical distancing, they should remember the importance of preventing fires in or around their homes.

Along with other essential services, the fire department has had to implement safeguards and physical distancing protocols in the workplace. Residents of the RM of Piney are advised that services will continue during the COVID-19 pandemic response:

- Alternate training procedures are in place to ensure that firefighters are, as always, prepared to respond.
- FIRE HALLS are closed to public access until further

The firefighters also urge the public to remain vigilant in the ongoing battle to prevent unintentional fires and injuries by practicing fire prevention and fire safety during these extraordinary times. "Regardless of the circumstances, additional time at home with family members provides an excellent opportunity to discuss fire safety and review your homes fire escape plan".

Here are some simple things that people can do to protect themselves and their families:

- Test smoke and carbon monoxide alarms using the test button. If the alarm fails to sound, check and replace batteries if necessary. Make sure everyone knows the sound of the alarms.
- Develop or review your home fire escape plan to make sure everyone in the household knows what to do if a fire occurs. Make sure to designate someone to help older adults, children, and anyone else who may need help to escape.
- Use care when using and recharging electronic devices such as laptops, tablets, or mobile devices. Check electrical cords and charge cables to ensure they are in good condition. Don't overload electrical circuits. Avoid placing electronics on soft surfaces like beds or upholstered furniture when recharging to avoid the risk of overheating.

As the RM of Piney Fire Service continues to do our best to the community under these extraordinary circumstances, it is imperative that the public does all that they can to practice fire safety in the home and take the necessary steps to protect themselves and their families from the risk of fire and carbon monoxide poisoning.

This is the third Piney Regional Chamber of Commerce Year in Review. We continue to build on the year-over-year success due to our engaged membership. We're proud of the work we are doing in our communities and would like to share a few of those accomplishments.

PRCC Milestone Achievements:

Development of PRCC Strategic Plan:

After securing funding in 2018 for an environmental scan of regional economic development, the next step was to review the findings of that consultant report and generate our own Strategic Plan for the PRCC. A small committee was formed and, from there, we were able to identify five key areas where we will focus as a Chamber. Those five items are the development of a PRCC website, continued focus on youth retention and community awareness through our annual Career Symposium, Community Services Co-op development, establishing a visioneering committee and continuing to provide training opportunities for members. One key element in all of this was the need to drive our local government to see the value in the position of an economic development officer for the RM of Piney to support further economic development and bolster the efforts of the PRCC. Our local council supported this goal when, in late 2019, they successfully hired our new Economic Development Manager. The position was developed to be shared with the RM of Stuartburn to provide regional benefit.

2019 Career Symposium:

The 2019 Career Symposium was our largest and most successful event to date as a Chamber. We continued our partnership with Ross L Gray School as well as the RM of Piney and, with supportive funding secured from provincial grants as well as the RMs of Piney and Stuartburn, we were able to create a memorable event for everyone in attendance.

We showcased 30 exhibitors and welcomed guest speakers from the Canada Border Services Agency, RCMP and the Canadian Armed Forces. Our keynote speaker Kevin Chief delivered a powerful and inspirational message that impacted students, exhibitors and community members in attendance.
