2020/2021 Overdue Taxes

Tax Sale Processing Deadline: Tuesday, March 31st

RM taxes for 2021 were due on October 29th. If you happened to miss this deadline and also have 2020 taxes still owing on your property, your property will incur tax sale costs if not paid by March 31st, 2022.

For all rate payers who have 2020 and 2021 taxes owing, a letter will be issued to you later this month stating what you have owing for 2020 including arrears and penalties. This amount is <u>due by Thursday, March 31st, 2022.</u> The letter will not state the amount due for 2021 taxes since only 2020 needs to be paid so the property will not incur additional tax sale costs. Commencing April 1st, 2022, tax sale costs will be added to your property as well as monthly penalties.

The following are not accepted as household items and must be placed in the appropriate areas; please see dump attendant for details.












Medical, dead animals & radioactive waste are not accepted at any of our waste disposal sites!

Sunrise Corner's Online Directory is Now Live

It's a new year and we've got exciting news — our online directory is now live on the Sunrise Corner website. We are proud to help raise awareness about all the businesses, non-profits and organizations in our region that add so much to our communities. And by doing so, we hope they are able to reach more customers and increase sales.

For residents, the directory is a simple way to search for the products and services they're looking for in Sunrise Corner. You can search by business name, category or location (any community in the RMs of Piney and Stuartburn). Or just hit the "Search" button with no parameters, and all listings will come up.

This community resource is easy to use, but it needs input from all business owners, non-profit boards and community club volunteers to ensure we're accurately listing your organization. The system allows an authorized representative to add a listing if there isn't one yet or claim a listing if it already exists. These actions will be approved by an administrator before going live.

The process is super simple.

- Visit the online directory at: www.sunrisecornermb.ca/business-listings.
- Search the directory to see if your organization is listed. We uploaded all the info from the printed directories the municipal offices had created, so many organizations already have a basic listing.
- Click on the "Add Listing" drop down menu at the top
 of the page and choose "How to Add a New Listing
 and Claim Your Listing". If your business is not listed,
 just follow the instructions to Submit a New Listing. If
 your business is listed, follow the instructions to Claim
 Your Listing.

The listings include all kinds of contact info whether phone number, email address, social media accounts, or your website. The description can include products or services, operating hours, special promotions, ordering, delivery or payment options, really any information that would be useful to your customers. If you want customers to come directly to your location, just enter a street address and the system will automatically generate a Google map. If you don't want customers visiting (like if you work from home), use your PO box or even just a town to show where you're located. You can also add photos and logos – remember, a picture is worth a thousand words.

If you've got any questions or would like assistance adding or updating your listing, send me an email. Alternatively, if you see a business listed that is no longer operating, let me know. We want this to be the most complete and accurate listing of all the businesses and organizations in Sunrise Corner.

Your Guide to Local Government

Joint Boards & Partnerships

Partnerships with other municipalities is one way for the RM of Piney to expand opportunities and services for rate payers.

Stuartburn-Piney Weed Board

The RM of Stuartburn/Emerson-Franklin weed board was established in 1967. In 2014, it became the R.M. of Stuartburn-Piney weed board. The weed board works to prevent the spread of invasive weeds that can cause damage to fields and livestock. The team strives to spray responsibly, following the recommendations from the Manitoba Weed Supervisor's Association.

Sunrise Corner

In 2016 the Sunrise Corner Tourism board was started to promote tourism in the RMs of Piney and Stuartburn. In 2019 the Piney Stuartburn Economic Development District was formed to oversee the Sunrise Corner initiative. Sunrise Corner prioritizes local business development, housing development and tourism within the two RMs.

Seine Rat River Conservation District

The SRRWD was established in partnership with local municipalities and the Province of Manitoba Conservation Districts Program in January of 2002. Members of the RM council as well as appointed landowners sit on SRRWD district committees. The SRRCD develops and delivers land and water management programs that are available to all local land owners and agriculturalists.

Southeast Community Services Co-op

The SECSC is a non-profit, developed in 2019 by the RM of Piney, the Piney Regional Chamber of Commerce and East Borderland Community Housing. It is comprised of locals with an interest in developing senior housing within southeastern Manitoba.

Buffalo Point Piney Stuartburn Waste Management Board

The BPPS Recycling and Waste Management Board was officially launched in 2021 due to the departure of Eastman Recycling from the southeastern region. With this new initiative, ratepayers will have ownership over the program and not be subject to contracted services. The partnership seeks to provide a more environmentally sustainable approach to waste management for southeastern Manitoba.

RCMP has had several reports of telephone frauds in the past month. These are not new and continue to happen. Whether it's someone saying they are from Canada Revenue Agency and you owe money, or that you have a package being held by Canada Border Services Agency and need to pay a fine, or even if a friend or family member has been stopped by the Police and they need bail money, DO NOT FALL FOR THIS! None of these agencies including the RCMP are going to call you and ask to be sent money in the mail! According to the Canadian Anti Fraud Center who track scams of all types in Canada, as of October 2021, Canadians have lost \$198 Million dollars this year to various scams! Don't be the next victim! Most of these scammers will force a sense of urgency on you to send money right away. That should be a red flag. Call the Sprague RCMP and report the incident. We can tell you if it's a scam or not. The bottom line is if you get a suspicious phone call hang up!
