Step 6: Implement Your Marketing Plan

Product

The product is the goods or services you'll be selling to your customers. The features and benefits of your product will drive the rest of the marketing mix. Bottom-line, how do your products and/or services make your potential customers' lives easier or better and what is that worth to them?

Price

The price is what your customers will pay for your goods or services. You'll know from your research how you're going to price your products compared to your competitors. Remember, lower pricing is not always the answer – sometimes demonstrating value warrants a higher price that customers are willing to pay. Providing excellent customer service adds significantly to that value.

Place

The place is the location where you're selling your product. From your planning process, you already know if you're going to have a bricks-and-mortar store or if you're offering your product online. You might also have a transient strategy where you sell at local festivals, farmer's markets, consumer or trade shows, or direct to customers in their homes.

Promotion

Promotion is the advertising to get information about your goods and/or services to your ideal customers. All the other elements of the marketing mix determine what tactics you'll use. If you are selling online, you'll need a website with e-commerce capabilities and a social media strategy to drive traffic to your site. If you have a physical store, you might use some combination of curb appeal, signage, social media, website and word of mouth referrals to get people through the door.

Warm summer weather is finally here! Make sure you get outside and enjoy all that the RM of Pinev has to offer during the next few months. Sprague RCMP continues to receive reports of telephone frauds in the area. These are not new and continue to happen. Whether it's someone saving they are from Canada Revenue Agency and you owe money, or that you have a package being held by Canada Border Services Agency and need to pay a fine, or even if a friend or family member has been stopped by the Police and they need bail money, DO NOT FALL FOR THIS! None of these agencies including the RCMP are going to call you and ask to be sent money in the mail! In fact you should never send money in the mail, to anyone! According to the Canadian Anti Fraud Center who track scams of all types in Canada, as of May 31st 2022, Canadians have lost \$207 Million dollars this year to various scams, and we aren't even half way through the year. Don't be the next victim! Most of these scammers will force a sense of urgency on you to send money right away. That should be a red flag. Call the Sprague RCMP and report the incident. We can tell you if it's a scam or not. You can also check out the Canadian Anti Fraud Website at https://www.antifraudcentre-centreantifraude.ca or call their Toll Free Number at 1-888-495-8501. The bottom line is if you get a suspicious phone call hang up!

It continues to be a wet summer. The mosquitoes are pretty thick in spots around the RM. A quick review of the weather forecast for July yielded the following forecast:

Temperature: July will be moderately hot with an average low of 14.8°C (58.6°F) and an average high of 25.4°C (77.7°F).

Precipitation: July, it will rain for 14 days, with typically 53mm (2.09") of accumulated precipitation.

The chance of flooding should be minimal; however, heavy rains can occur and cause some overland flooding in certain areas of the RM. With July's forecasted temperatures being a little cooler than normal, and regular rain being forecasted, our risk of wildfire should be low during the month of July.

Below is a list of natural mosquito repellants:

- Lemon eucalyptus oil. Used since the 1940s, lemon eucalyptus oil is one of the more well-known natural repellents.
- Lavender
- Cinnamon oil
- Thyme oil
- Greek catmint oil
- Soybean oil
- Citronella
- Tea tree oil


