## **MONTHLY REMINDERS**

### 2023 Tax Deadline

All 2023 RM of Piney taxes were due on October 31<sup>st</sup>, 2023. If you missed the deadline, your RM account will incur interest charges of 1.25% on the first day of each month following the deadline. Payments can be made online (Credit Union or Caisse banks), over the phone with credit card, by mailing in a cheque, or in the office by debit/credit, cash, or cheque.

### Winter Garbage Dump Hours

As of November 5<sup>th</sup>, 2023, the hours of all three garbage dumps in the RM of Piney will change to 9:00am to 5:00pm on the regular days the dump is scheduled to be open.

### **Council Meetings**

### The RM of Piney Climate Action Plan

The RM has now started the process of developing an RM of Piney Climate Action Plan. The climate action plan will ensure that the RM of Piney is prepared to adapt to or mitigate climate hazards and risks. The development of this plan relies heavily on public participation and engagement. Through a series of community and stakeholder engagement sessions, residents in this region will:

- Identify climate risks/hazards most prevalent;
- Use climate modelling to show how climate risks and hazards are predicted to change over time;
- Look at the impacts of the hazards/risks to the RM;
- Identify ways that the RM of Piney can be prepared to mitigate or adapt to the climate hazards.

We are inviting you to get involved in this process and use your voice to help us understand current climate hazards and risks and identify ways that the Municipality can be prepared for these climate impacts.

The first way that you can get involved is to share your thoughts on climate change in our Climate Action Plan Survey. This survey will gather initial thoughts and ideas on climate change and how it impacts this region.

### **Hunting Ethics**

We would like to remind you to practice ethical hunting to keep everyone including yourself, safe at all times. If you are unfamiliar with the area, please stop by the RM office to take a look at the municipal map.

### Respect Private Property:

- Ask landowners for permission to hunt;

- Follow restrictions on when & where you may hunt;
   Leave all gates the way you found them;
- Never enter private land unless you have obtained permission first;

### Respect Yourself:

Always let someone know where you are;
If there is a change in plans, leave a visible note;
Practice basic life skills of first aid and survival.

Respect for Laws and Enforcement Officers:

- Obey all laws – do not hunt off roadways;

Ethical hunters will not condone lawbreaking by ignoring illegal acts they observe when afield;
When meeting enforcement officers working in the field, be cooperative and provide all requested info.

### **Recycling Incentive Program**

With a decrease in our recycling numbers over the past few years, the RM is optimistic that recycling numbers will increase with the use of a Recycling Incentive Program. **This program will commence January 2024** and will be done in the form of a monthly draw using tickets received. This ticket system will work by receiving a ticket for every recycling bag you drop off at our recycling facilities. **Our goal is to receive 5,000kgs+ of recycling per month.** 

### **Rules & Regulations:**

- For every blue bag you recycle (or items of the equivalent size of a blue recycling bag), you will receive a ticket that will be entered into our monthly draw;
- Recycling bags must be dropped off at one of our three waste transfer sites: Sprague, Menisino/Piney, Woodridge;
- If you use a community recycling bin, tickets can be picked up at the RM office;
- If someone drops off your recycling for you, it is your responsibility to get your tickets from that individual;
- Once a ticket is received, the "KEEP THIS TICKET" portion is to be kept by the resident, while the other ticket is to be given back to dump attendant or RM office;
- If you do not want to keep your portion of the ticket, you must write your name on the back of the ticket that stays with the dump attendant or RM office;
- Only residents of the RM will be able to participate;
- Draws will be done by the 21<sup>st</sup> of the following month. i.e. tickets received in January will be drawn in February;
- Winners will be announced on social media after the 21<sup>st</sup> of each month as well as in our monthly RM of Piney newsletter by mentioning the winning ticket number along with the winner's name, if it is included on the winning ticket; by participating in the draw, you are agreeing to your name being published in our newsletter;
- The winning ticket will be announced the month following the draw. i.e. the winning ticket drawn in February will be announced in our March newsletter;
- Winners are to come down to the RM office to pick which prize they would like; please bring your ticket, a picture of your winning ticket, or I.D. that matches the name on the winning ticket when picking up your prize;
- Prizes must be picked up by the end of the month your ticket was announced. i.e. your ticket is announced in the March newsletter, you must contact the RM office and have your prize picked up by the last day of March;
- If prizes are not picked up within the month that winning ticket was announced, another ticket will be drawn in place of the unclaimed ticket; we suggest you keep your tickets or take a photo of them in case of a re-draw;
- After each monthly draw, the leftover tickets from that month will be destroyed and only new tickets received will be eligible to win for the following months draw;
- Prizes are \$200-\$250 in value and range from gift cards to outdoor furniture/décor;
- There is no limit on how many times one person can win, so keep recycling to see if you can win more than once!
