MONTHLY REMINDERS

Burning Permits Required

April 1st - November 15th

Open fires are prohibited from April 1st to November 15th except under a burning permit or in an enclosed approved fire pit. Call MB Conservation at 204-437-2348 (Sprague) on either Mondays or Wednesdays, or contact 204-346-6110 (Steinbach) to obtain a burning permit.

No burning is allowed before 6:00pm or when winds exceed 15 km/hr unless authorized by MB Conservation.

Fire Pit Regulations

Fire pits shall be fully enclosed and constructed of masonry, concrete, heavy gauge metal, or a non-combustible material;

- The outdoor fire pit shall not exceed 100cm in depth and shall be over 15cm in height when measured from the surrounding grade to the top of the pit opening;
- Fire pit openings shall not exceed 107cm in diameter or an area of 0.89 square meters;
- In use fire pits shall have continuous adult supervision; A means of extinguishment shall be readily available. Fires must be completely extinguished before leaving the site.

Building Inspector Message

Building season is well under way in the RM of Piney. With construction in full swing, I ask building permit holders to please give me a 24-48 hour heads up for inspections, especially during the summer, so I can accommodate your project timelines.

Just a reminder that any building over 108 sq. ft. must apply for a building permit BEFORE the work is commenced. If a build is started prior to a permit being applied for and signed off on, a By-Law Enforcement Officer will be contacted, and double fees will be charged.

Before a building application can be accepted, zoning must be approved, which can take up to two weeks before this process can be completed. After that time, I will be in contact with the applicant to schedule the first inspection.

There are many considerations that should be factored into the decision on where to apply for a summer-job. Does one take a job for the money, the career prospects or the experience? Here are five elements to think about when contemplating the benefits and outcomes of a summer job.

Career exploration. Summer jobs can help high school students explore different career paths that might interest them. Working with a business, not-profit or government entity is invaluable in learning how different workplaces operate and how leadership is structured. The summer job experience can also help to narrow down interests to make a post-secondary education direction easier to choose.

Skill development. Employment helps develop critical skills like time management, communication, teamwork, and decision making that are transferable to future education and career pursuits. The experience demonstrates first-hand what skills are needed for future career path planning.

Resume building. Working in a field of interest adds relevant professional experience to a resume that will help land future jobs and internships. Experience can help move a resume to the top of the pile for full-time career opportunities.



Well Water Testing - May 23rd

Seine Rat Roseau Watershed District will be supplying pickup for well water testing, at the provincially subsidized cost of private well water testing is **\$25.00**, including tax (regular rate is \$30.00). Each location is eligible for one sample per well per year; you must be the owner of the well; and this must be first sample since April 1st of 2024.

Payments must be exact cash or cheque ONLY, with cheques made payable to Horizon Lab Ltd.

Only samples that are accompanied by correct payment and completed forms will be accepted.

Water sample bottles & application forms can be picked up in advance at the RM office. Water samples must be taken on the same day as the drop-off. You can drop your water sample off at the RM office in Vassar prior to 10:00 am, along with your completed Chain of Custody and SRRWD Application forms on the either Thursday, May 23rd or Thursday, June 27th.

Notice to All Dog Owners

The RM has received a high volume of dog complaints related to running at large and barking. If you are a dog owner, you have legal responsibilities under the Animal Control By-Law.

Per By-Law No. 118/2016 Responsibility of owners regarding dogs:

7(1) No owner shall:

- a) Permit his dog to run at large. When a dog is found running at large, it's owner shall be deemed to have failed or refused to comply with this subsection;
- b) Permit his dog to bark or howl or in any other way unduly disturb the quiet of any person or persons anywhere in the Municipality;
- c) Permit his dog/cat to defecate on any public or private property other than the property of its owner. Where a dog/cat defecates on property other than the property of the owner, the owner shall cause such excrement to be removed forthwith;
- d) Permit his dog/cat to damage public property or private property other than that of the owner. Where public property or private property other than that of the owner. Where public or private property has been damaged by a dog/cat its owner shall be deemed to have failed or refused to comply with this subsection;
- Permit his dog/cat to pursue, bite, wound or worry any person or animal, whether or not on the property of the owner;
- h) Permit his dog/cat on any school ground/playground;
