# Tips for Writing Successful Grant Applications

Writing a grant application can be a daunting task, but with careful planning and attention to detail, you can greatly increase your chances of securing funds for your project. Whether you are applying to build a multi-million-dollar capital project or purchase a new lawn mower, the principles of writing a compelling grant application remain largely the same. - **5. Include Supporting Documents.** Attach any required documentation, such as letters of support, resumes of key personnel, or contractor quotes. Ensure all supplementary material is formatted according to the funder's specifications.
- **6. Review and Revise.** Proofread your grant application carefully to eliminate errors in grammar, punctuation and formatting. Ask colleagues or mentors to review your proposal for clarity and coherence. Incorporate their feedback to strengthen your application.

## RM of Piney's STARS donation supports critical care for its residents

May 13, 2024 (Vassar, Manitoba): The Rural Municipality of Piney continues its partnership with STARS to help fund the STARS program and its life-saving efforts. The RM of Piney supports two forms of donations to STARS. The first is a \$1.00 donation per capita, in which the RM is proud to be one of the first in Manitoba to make this commitment. The second is the STARS Fund-a-Flight program, which is a four-year commitment of \$5,400 per year. These donations and the outstanding commitment of the STARS team has had a tangible impact across the Municipality's communities. In 2023 alone, STARS responded to seven calls in the RM of Piney.

"If our support helps save one life, it's worth every penny. We are proud to partner with such a dedicated operational and medical team that can reach our remote communities within minutes", states Reeve Wayne Anderson from the RM of Piney.

The RM of Piney has within its boundaries, 12 communities spread over an area of 2,400 km², of which 70% encompasses the Sandilands Provincial Forest. The Municipality's close access to vast forest resources and its adjacency to the Lake of the Woods, make it a highly sought after resource for residents and industry including peat moss, agriculture, forestry and tourism, to name a few. The remoteness of the area with its many trail systems, makes having STARS ever more important when a critical incident arises. For some residents, this means getting emergency hospital access within minutes versus an hour to drive to the nearest hospital in Steinbach, which can be a life-saving difference.

#### **About STARS**

STARS is a lifeline for patients in rural, remote, and indigenous communities across Western Canada. From a single helicopter to a network of highly skilled professionals providing care in the air, on the ground, or virtually, STARS has grown into a leading-edge innovator, harnessing our passion for saving lives to shape the future of critical care.

STARS was founded in Alberta in 1985. It all began when a pregnant woman from a rural community died from blood loss, leaving a father alone with their newborn. For STARS' founders, her death was one too many. Something had to be done.

Motivated to change emergency care for the patients who needed it, these founders created a helicopter air ambulance service which was built and supported by the community. Today, STARS provides critical care, anywhere from six bases across Western Canada.

STARS was first deployed in Manitoba in the spring of 2009 and has since flown over 6000 missions in our province – impacting thousands of lives in the process. As STARS has grown and evolved, STARS has never wavered from their mission. Fundamentally, they believe that where you live – or work, play and travel – shouldn't impact your chance of survival in an emergency.

Thanks to the support of community allies like the RM of Piney, STARS will be there for the next patient who needs them.
