MONTHLY REMINDERS

2024 Tax Deadline

All 2024 RM of Piney taxes were due on October 31st, 2024. If you missed the deadline, your RM account will incur interest charges of 1.25% on the first day of each month following the deadline. Payments can be made online (Credit Union or Caisse banks), over the phone with credit card (with 2% admin fee), by mailing in a cheque, or in the office by debit/credit, cash, or cheque.

RM Of Piney Grants

The deadline for all 2025 RM of Piney grant applications is Wednesday, January 15th, 2025. All RM grants will follow this new deadline. More information can be found in our new Community Grants Policy located on our website.

Winter Transfer Station Hours

As of November 3rd, 2024, the hours of all three RM of Piney transfer stations will change to 9:00am to 5:00pm on the regular days the dump is scheduled to be open.
