Seeking Contractors for Municipal Road Mowing

The RM of Piney is seeking contractors for mowing and brushing along municipal roads within parts of our municipality. We require the use of a triplex offset mower to handle top-cut mowing on all municipal roads, with operations typically beginning by mid-July. A map detailing the roads needing mowing and subsequent brushing will be provided.

Brushing activities are generally conducted after the completion of the top cut mowing. We also mandate that time clocks be installed on most of the equipment hired for RM work. Interested contractors must complete a Bid Hourly Contractor Form, listing the types of equipment available and their hourly rates. This form can be accessed on the RM of Piney Website:

Please note, we do not allow fuel cost adjustments. Contractors can update their hourly rates at any time during the year by submitting a new bid hourly form. Additionally, proof of insurance and worker's compensation coverage is required.



When in doubt, check the **Recyclepedia**. It shows you what can go in your blue bin and what *can't*. It will tell you any special recycling instructions, and let you know if other recycling options are available for items that can't go in your blue bin.
