A REMINDER TO ALL: Even though the RM may have a different ban in place than Manitoba Wildfire Services at said time, the public is to follow the stricter of the two bans in place for the whole municipality.



ROAD CLOSED

One-Way Traffic on Fraser Avenue & Chenier Street (Rd 76E) AND Prevost Street CLOSED in South Junction on July 1st

Fraser Ave. & Chenier St. (Rd 76E) in South Junction will be converted to one-way traffic only on July 1st for the South Junction Canada Day event. Traffic must enter Fraser Ave. off of Main St. in South Junction. The flow of traffic will be Fraser Ave. to Chenier St. (Rd 76E) to HWY 12. HWY 12 & Chenier St. will be used to exit the event.

Prevost Street in South Junction will be closed to all through traffic in the evening of July 1st.



EA057 Wildfire Meeting

The RM of Piney recently held a meeting on June 4th at the Woodridge Community Club due to our recent wildfire situation near St. Labre, Florze, Badger, Carrick, and Woodridge. Residents who were affected by the EA057 Wildfire joined Council, RM administration and MLA for La Vérendrye, Konrad Narth, for a community debrief and question period.

During that time, the following comments/concerns were brought forth from our residents:

- Better communication with communities
- Reception Centre location and confusion with registration of evacuees
 - Policing not present during evacuation
- Firesmart / Emergency Skill Workshops more education needed for residents
- Other means of communication than social media/news
 - Maintenance of Fireguards
 - Concern over lack of fire support in St. Labre no warning
 - Community wants to meet with MWS
 - Start PEAT again throughout our communities
- Concerns over fire departments roles & responsibilities while on Crown lands
 - Mental Health of evacuees
 - Concerns over CNR
- More funding put towards fire protection should be the RM's main priority
- Funding towards PEAT and Emergency Coordinator
- Having water holes located along the railway tracks
 - Debris left on Crown land by logging companies
- Timeline of when residents can see changes made by the RM & guidelines to what the changes will look like
 - Resources available to seniors
 - Evacuation Process

The RM appreciates everyone that attended and are taking some time to reflect and focus on some very important concerns brought to our attention and comments that the RM have already begun the process of dealing with. Additional information and further communication to the public regarding the topics discussed in the meeting will be done through our monthly newsletters and our website.

Sprague RCMP

I hope everyone is enjoying the warmer weather and aren't being terrorized by the mosquitos and other insects that come with that!

Given this warmer weather and with some communities having a dryer than average year I wanted to draw attention to the Restrictions put in place by the province to keep us safe. Conservation and RCMP have been getting many reports of individuals ignoring the restrictions put on All Terrain Vehicles (ATV's) for back country travel. These restrictions were put in place to prevent further fire outbreaks in the area. The province understands that the risk of these fires is extremely high and this is their action to mitigate this risk. By driving ATV's around communities and down backroad trails, a new fire can be lit. It is extremely hard for Conservation to put out these fires, especially if they have grown momentum.

During the last fire Conservation worked tirelessly alongside local fire departments to mitigate a lot of property damage that could have been inflicted. I implore you to listen to guidance that was put in place and not contravene their decisions. As the next fire could result in even more damage. If we receive calls about this, they are taken seriously.

I respect those that are treading on the cautious side, many have taken the liberty to call us to inquire if lawn mowers are included in the ban of off-road vehicles. I will add in this newsletter that in our understanding lawn mowers are not included in the ban. Individuals can continue to use lawn mowers especially as long grass can be a fire hazard in its own right. I recommend being responsible with the dead trimmings by not burning them, as the burn ban is still in place.

For all non-emergency matters including Criminal Record Checks, please contact the Sprague RCMP Detachment at (204) 437-2041. Our admin for Criminal Record Checks work from Tuesday to Thursday 9-5. Should you require immediate Police assistance you can call (204) 437-2222 or 911 in the case of an emergency.

Fire Department Upgrades!

Two of our local fire departments have received some vital upgrades in the past few months.

Station 2 - Sprague Fire Department

After three years of fundraising the Sprague Fire Department now has a brand new 2025 Can-Am Defender HD10 6x6!

Sprague Fire Department was able to raise 2/3 of the cost to acquire this new UTV and with the additional 1/3 support by the RM were able to purchase the 6x6 in May of this year.

This vehicle has the ability to navigate tough terrain where traditional fire trucks struggle, ensuring firefighters can reach emergencies faster. Whether it's wildfire suppression, medical evacuations, or search-and-rescue missions, a 6x6 UTV can adapt to multiple scenarios.

With a few upgrades/additions this vehicle will be well equipped for the many tasks it will face.



Station 3 – Woodridge Fire Department

Woodridge Fire Department had tracks and power steering installed on their 6x6 in April of this year. They will most definitely be put to the test during our winter months.





FireSmart 101

More so than ever before, Canadians are feeling the direct and indirect impacts of wildfire. There is a growing need for FireSmart $^{\text{TM}}$ education. FireSmart Canada has developed a FREE one-hour course for those who are getting started with FireSmart and want to learn more. 


The Advanced Home Assessment Program is a voluntary property assessment program for residents looking to determine and mitigate their home and property's risk to wildfire. It's the next step to take after using the FireSmart Begins at Home app or completing the self-assessment scorecard.

The Advanced Home Assessment is conducted by a formally trained assessor. The assessor will visit the property with the resident and review key areas within the **home ignition zone**. The assessment will highlight areas of risk and provide specific recommendations of actions and upgrades residents can take to increase their property's resilience to wildfire. The assessor will provide a comprehensive report once the assessment is complete. Homeowners Affordability Tax Credit

For the 2025 tax year, the Education Property Tax Credit (EPTC) has been replaced with a new Homeowners Affordability Tax Credit (HATC). This is a Provincial initiative, and the RM of Piney will continue to share information as it becomes available.

Frequently Asked Questions:

What changes have been made to school tax rebates and credits for the 2025 tax year?

Key changes include:

- The Education Property Tax Credit (EPTC) is being replaced with the Homeowners Affordability Tax Credit (HATC). The amount of the HATC is the lesser of \$1,500 and the gross school taxes on your principal residence.
- The School Tax Rebate, which provided a 50% rebate on school taxes for residential and farm properties, and a 10% rebate on school taxes for other properties, is being eliminated for all properties except farm properties. Farm properties will continue to receive the 50% rebate, applied directly on the property tax statement.
- There is no additional seniors credit as part of the HATC, but the Seniors School Tax Rebate continues to be available. The Seniors School Tax rebate is being maintained at \$235 minus 1.0% on family net annual income over \$40,000 for principal residences only. This rebate is claimed on the personal income tax return.

The HATC Advance can only be claimed on a homeowner's principal residence. To check on whether your principal residence has been declared for the 2025 property tax year, you can enter your information in the online form (link below) and someone will respond to you by phone or email to confirm if your principal residence has been declared.
