Winter Transfer Station Hours

2025 Tax Deadline

All 2025 RM of Piney taxes are due on October 31st, 2025. If you missed the deadline, your RM account will incur interest charges of 1.25% on the first day of each month following the deadline. Payments can be made online (Credit Union or Caisse banks), over the phone with credit card (2% admin fee starting November 1st), by mailing in a cheque, or in the office by debit/credit, cash, or cheque.



Protecting Your Property: Sprague RCMP's Tips to Prevent Property Crime

Across the RM of Piney, property crimes such as thefts from vehicles, break-ins, and vandalism are among the most commonly reported offences. These crimes often occur when valuable items are left unsecured or when seasonal properties like cabins are left unattended for long periods. The Sprague RCMP reminds the residents of Piney that a few proactive steps can make a significant difference in keeping your property safe.

At Home

Lock it up: Always lock your doors and windows, even when you're home or away for a short time.

Light up your property: Motion sensor or timed exterior lighting can deter would-be thieves.

Hide your valuables: Keep tools, bicycles, and outdoor equipment out of sight and secured in garages or sheds.

Know your neighbours: A connected community is one of the best deterrents to crime. Watch out for each other and report suspicious activity to the RCMP immediately.

At the Cabin

Don't leave valuables behind: Take electronics, alcohol, and other desirable items home when the season ends.

Secure doors and windows: Reinforce locks and consider using window bars or shutters for added protection.

Install trail cameras or security systems: These can help capture valuable evidence if a crime occurs.

Keep it clear: Trim trees and shrubs around the cabin to eliminate hiding spots near doors and windows.

If you see something, say something!

Reporting suspicious activity promptly helps us investigate before crimes escalate. Note descriptions, vehicle details, and license plates whenever possible. Your call could help prevent another crime in your community. Together we can help reduce property crime in the RM. Taking simple steps today can protect your home, your belongings, and your peace of mind.
